Tolling of the Boats



USS S-39 (SS-144) Lost on 14 August 1942 when it was destroyed after grounding on a reef south of Rossel Island Louisande Archipelago. All the crew were rescued.



USS Flier (SS-250) Lost with 78 men on 13 August 1944 when sunk by Japanese mine in the Balabac Strait south of Palawan. Eight men survived and were later rescued by USS Redfin (SS-272)



USS Harder (**SS-257**) Lost with all hands (79 men) during a Japanese depth charge attack off Luzon, Republic of the Philippines, on 24 August 1944.



USS Bullhead (SS-332) Lost with all hands (84 men) off the Bali Coast by a Japanese air attack on 6 august 1945



USS Cochino (**SS-345**) Lost with one man lost on 26 August 1949 off the coast of Norway due to a battery explosion and fire. Six men from the USS Tusk (SS-426) were also lost in the rescue operation.



USS Pompano (SS-181) Lost with all hands (76 men) by possible Japanese mine off Honshu, Japan between 8 August and 27 September 1943.



U.S. Coast Guard Catch Traffickers With 232 Bales Of Cocaine At Sea

WFMY, August 2

Miami Beach, FL -- Tuesday, a U.S. Coast Guard ship pulled into the harbor in Miami Beach with over 200 bales of illegal drugs and a story to tell.

It started nearly two weeks ago when a plane noticed what appeared to be a submarine in the Western Caribbean. The U.S. Coast Guard was sent to check it out.

What they found off the coast of Honduras was a semi-submersible boat loaded with drugs. The Coast Guard crew was able to arrested the traffickers but before they could confiscate the drugs the submersible sank, which is a tactic traffickers use to protect their cargo.

Using sonar the Coast Guard was able to locate the submersible in about 65 feet of water. Working with the FBI, it took divers three days to bring up all the bales of drugs.

In all, the submersible was carrying 232 bales of pure cocaine with a street value of 180 million dollars.

This was the first time a drug submersible was discovered and caught in the Caribbean. Submersibles are typically used on the west coast. It is estimated that nearly a third of illegal drugs shipped to the U.S. are coming in to the country on these submersibles because of their stealth.

Once the Coast Guard crew is finished unloading the drugs, they will be taken to be destroyed.

USS HENRY L. STIMSON fouls the fishing nets of a Spanish trawler while undergoing refresher training in the Rota area off Spain.

USS HENRY L. STIMSON (SSBN-655), a Benjamin Franklin-class ballistic missile submarine, was the only ship of the United States Navy to be named for Henry L. Stimson (1867-1950), who served as Secretary of the State and War.

Following shakedown, USS HENRY L. STIMSON was assigned to Submarine Squadron 16 and departed Charleston, South Carolina, on 23 February 1967 on her first deterrent patrol.

In 1971, USS HENRY L. STIMSON began her first overhaul, at Newport News Shipyard and Drydocking. In 1973, when she returned to duty, she no longer carried Polaris AS missiles, but rather the new Poseidon C3 missiles. Back in service, the boat was based at Rota, Spain, while her crew lived in Charleston, South Carolina.

In 1980, USS HENRY L. STIMSON was converted pier side at Port Canaveral, Florida, from Poseidon missiles to Trident-1 missiles. Following that conversion, the boat changed homeports to Kings Bay, Georgia, where she was based for the rest of her career.

Both decommissioned and stricken from the Naval Vessel Registry on May 5th 1993,USS HENRY L. STIMSON went through the Navy's Nuclear Powered Ship and Submarine Recycling Program in Bremerton, Washington, and ceased to exist on August 12, 1994
